Marla (Miriam) Leigh Goldstein is internationally recognized as a leading specialist in the ancient instruments known as frame drums. Marla's music is deeply rooted in ancient and original Hebrew prayer, polyrhythmic orchestrations, and meditative Middle Eastern rhythms. She received her BFA and MFA in Percussion Studies from CalArts, and has studied with master drummers including John Bergamo, Glen Velez, Swapan Chaudhuri and Randy Gloss.

originated in the ancient Middle East more than three thousand years ago.


Miriam, sister of Aaron and Moses, was the archetype of the female prophet. Her drumming and dancing was the climactic




Tof Miriam Workshop
